## THE HORNSEA TWO OFFSHORE WIND FARM ORDER 2016 VARIATION 2

On 8 February 2018, the Marine Management Organisation (MMO) received a request from from Ørsted to amend the Deemed Marine Licence (DML) A2 (Project A – Transmission Assets) and DML B2 (Project B – Transmission Assets) within Schedules 9 and 11 respectively of The Hornsea Two Offshore Wind Farm Order 2016.

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 72(3)(d) of the Marine and Coastal Access Act 2009, the MMO has made the amendments to the DMLs set out in the attached notice of variation.

If you wish to appeal then in accordance with Rule 22(1)(b) of the Tribunal Procedure (First-tier Tribunal)(General Regulatory Chamber) Rules 2009 (SI 2009/1976) you have 28 days from the date of the sending of the notice of variation to send or deliver a notice of appeal to the First-tier Tribunal.
