The Able Marine Energy Park Development Consent Order 2014 No. 2935: Notice of variation to Deemed Marine Licences under Schedule 8 of the order.

The Marine Management Organisation (MMO), as the Licensing Authority, has now completed its consideration of your variation requests dated 15 April 2020 for a variation to the Deemed Marine Licence (DML) under Section 72 of the Marine and Coastal Access Act 2009. The variation requested an administrative change to the DML.

The MMO has varied the DML in accordance with the information received from Able.

Since this licence constitutes a statutory consent, the terms and conditions set out therein must be complied with in full and are also binding upon any agent, sub-contractor or third party who undertakes any activity to which it refers on your behalf.

If you wish to appeal then in accordance with rule 22(1)(b) of the Tribunal Procedure (First-tier Tribunal) (General Regulatory Chamber) Rules 2009 (SI 2009/1976) you have 28 days from the date of the sending of the notice of variation to send or deliver a notice of appeal to the First-tier Tribunal.
