FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000: MINISTRY OF DEFENCE POLICE: SCHEDULE 21 OF THE CORONAVIRUS ACT.

We refer to your email dated 7 May 2020 to the Ministry of Defence Police which was acknowledged on the 11 May 2020.

We are treating your email as a request for information in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA 2000).

In your email you requested the following information:

"I am writing to you under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 to request the following information about Schedule 21 of the Coronavirus Act.

Please could you answer the following?

- 1. Since the Coronavirus Act came into force on 25 March, how many times between then and 20 April has your force used Schedule 21?
- 2. Please could you provide the date of each incidence of use? If that is not possible, please provide the week in which it happened e.g. w/c 30 March. If that is not possible, please provide the month in which it happened March or April.
- 3. Of the total number of times you used Schedule 21, how many times was it wrongfully used? This is something that might have been determined by a court. Please could you provide the dates for the wrongful incidents please? If that is not possible, please provide the week in which it happened e.g. w/c 30 March. If that is not possible, please provide the month in which it happened March or April.
- 4. Have you charged anyone with an offence under Schedule 21 because they did not answer a member of the police's question?"

A search for information has now been completed by the Ministry of Defence Police and I can confirm that we do hold information in scope of your request.
