

# **NOTICE OF ORDER**

## **Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981**

Northumberland County Council

Definitive Map Modification Order (No 12) 2017, Byway Open to All Traffic No 22 (Parish of Doddington)

Notice is hereby given that the above referenced Order has been submitted to the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs for determination. An Inspector will be appointed by the Secretary of State to determine the Order.

The **start date** for the above Order is **23 September 2020**.

Consideration of the Order will take the form of exchanges of statements of case and comments on statements of case.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to modify the definitive map and statement for the area by:-

### **Former Berwick-upon-Tweed Borough**

#### **Byway Open to All Traffic No 22 (Parish of Doddington)**

Adding thereto a byway open to all traffic, from a point marked Z, on the U1033 road, 625 metres south-east of Routin Lynn, in a southerly and south-easterly direction along the U1034 road for a distance of 1165 metres, to a point marked A, at a field gate across the road, 825 metres east of Fenton Hill Farm.

### **Timetable for sending in statements of case and comments**

#### **Within 2 weeks of the start date [by 7 October 2020]**

The Order Making Authority must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send a copy (excluding copies of any supporting documents - these will be available to view at the Authority's offices) to everyone who has made an objection or representation, the applicant and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order.

**Within 8 weeks of the start date [by 18 November 2020]**

Everyone who has made an objection or representation or any other written representation must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send full copies to the Authority. Copies (excluding copies of any supporting documents - these will be available to view at the Authority's offices) will also be sent to the applicant, every person who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order.

Within the same period the applicant (if applicable) must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, Secretary of State will send a full copy to the Authority. Copies will also be sent to everyone who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order (excluding copies of any supporting documents - these will be available to view at the Authority's offices).

**Within 14 weeks of the start date [by 30 December 2020]**

Everyone who has made an objection or representation, the Authority, the applicant (if applicable) and anyone who has written to us in respect of the Order must ensure that their comments on any or every other statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send copies of these comments to everyone else.

Any other person wishing to make representations in writing to the Secretary of State in respect of the above Order must do so in line with the timetable set out above.

In fairness to the other parties everyone should keep to the timetable to ensure that statements of case and comments are received on time. Late documents will be returned.

This Order is made by Northumberland County Council under Section 53(2)(b) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 ("the Act") because it appears to that authority that the Definitive Map and Statement of Public Rights of Way for the County of Northumberland require modification in consequence of the occurrence of events specified in Section 53(3)(c)(i) and (iii), namely, the discovery by the authority of evidence which (when considered with all other relevant evidence available to them) shows that a right of way which is not shown in the map and statement subsists or is reasonably alleged to subsist over land in the area to which the map relates, being a right of way such that the land over which the right subsists is a public path, a restricted byway or, subject to section 54A, a byway open to all traffic; and that there is no public right of way over land shown in the map and statement as a highway of any description, or any other particulars contained in the map and statement require modification.

The authority has consulted every local authority whose area includes the land to which the order relates. The Northumberland County Council hereby order that:

1. For the purposes of this Order the relevant date is 1 September 2017.
2. The Definitive Map and Statement of Public Rights of Way for the County of Northumberland shall be modified as described in the Schedule and shown on the map attached to the Order.
3. This Order shall take effect on the date it is confirmed and may be cited as The Northumberland County Council Definitive Map Modification Order (No 12) 2017.

## Description of Modification to Definitive Map and Statement

### Former Berwick-upon-Tweed Borough

#### **Doddington      Bridleway No 11      (NT 93 NE)**

Part I      Map:      The Map is not affected.

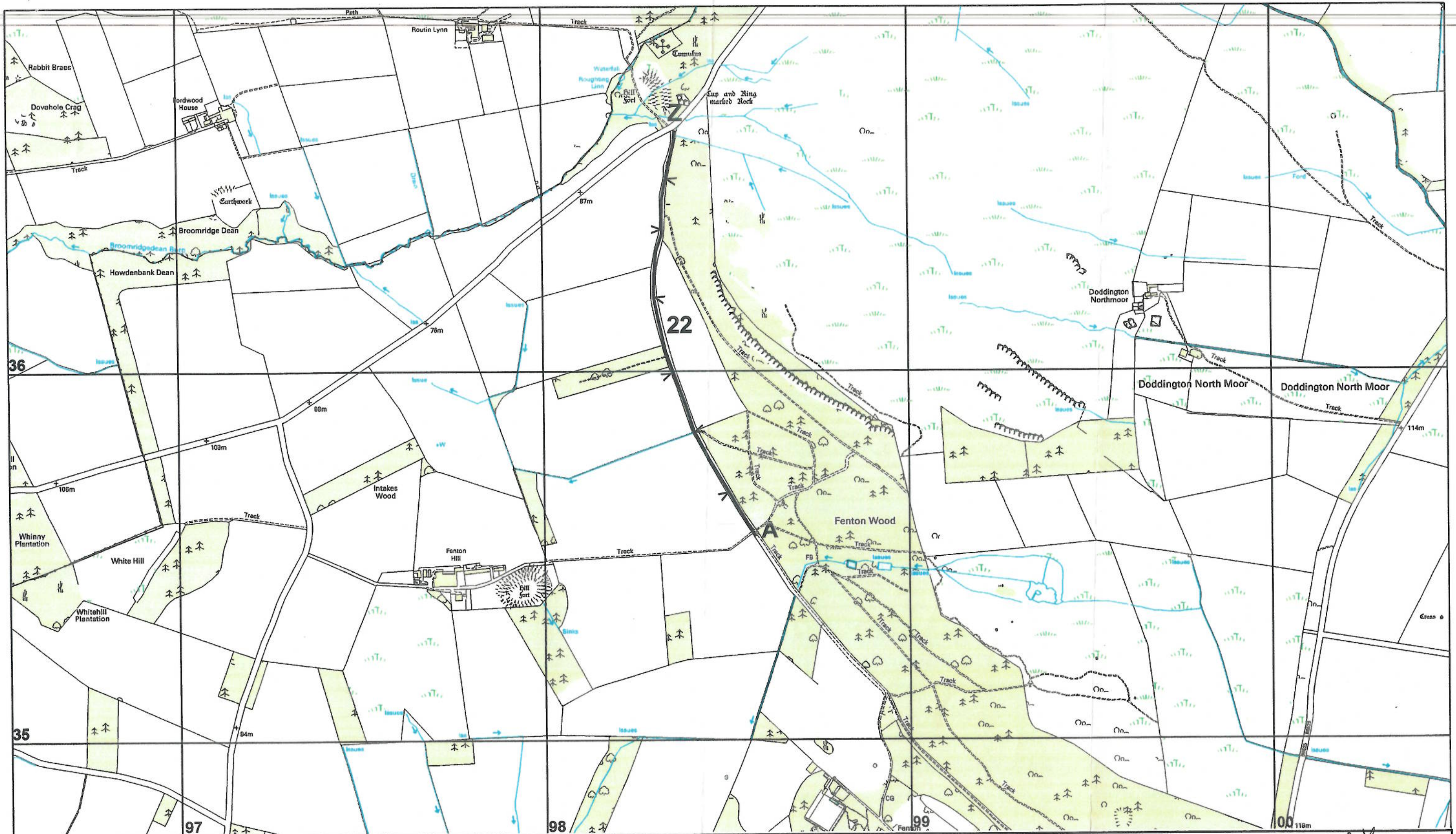
Part II      Statement:      To be amended as follows:  
From the Doddington-Lowick road south-west of Doddington North Moor Bridge in a westerly direction through Fenton Wood to join Byway Open to All Traffic No 22, east of Fentonhill.

#### **Doddington      Byway Open to All Traffic No 22      (NT 93 NE)**

Part I      Map:      Adding thereto a byway open to all traffic, from a point marked Z, on the U1033 road, 625 metres south-east of Routin Lynn, in a southerly and south-easterly direction along the U1034 road for a distance of 1165 metres, to a point marked A, at a field gate across the road, 825 metres east of Fenton Hill Farm.

Part II      Statement:      To be prepared as follows:  
As a variable 10 to 15 metre wide byway open to all traffic, from the U1033 road, 625 metres south-east of Routin Lynn, in a southerly direction for a distance of 460 metres. Thereafter as a 14 to 15.5 metre wide byway continuing in a southerly direction for a further 380 metres. Thereafter as a 15 to 15.5 metre wide byway in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 315 metres to a junction with Public Bridleway No 11, then for a further 10 metres to a field gate across the road, 825 metres east of Fenton Hill Farm.

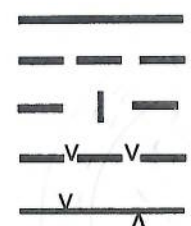
