Thank you for your email of 1 September 2020 to the Ministry of Defence (MOD) requesting the following information:

"Please can you provide the information which you have stated is available in respect of the following request

- How many Article 59s have been made during the period of August 2018 to present date
- How many Article 59s that have been made during this time were ruled in favour of Applicant"

A search for the information has now been completed within the MOD and I can confirm all information in scope of your request is held.

An Article 59 is a term used under the AFCS referring to a 'review due to ignorance or mistake'. Between 1 August 2018 and 31 March 2020, there have been 337 Article 59s registered under the Armed Forces Compensation Scheme (AFCS). Of these Article 59s, 229 were ruled in favour of the claimant. Please note, however, that of the 337 Article 59s registered within the specified timeframe, six do not have an outcome as of 31 March 2020. Therefore, the total figure regarding favourable outcomes should be treated as a minimum with the potential to change at a later date.

You may wish to note that even though your request asks for data up to the the present day, the latest date we can report to is 31 March 2020 as figures are compiled only at the end of the financial year.
