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JUDGMENT

Employment Tribunals Rules of Procedure 2013 – Rule 21

1. The 1st respondent has made an unauthorised deduction from the claimant's wages and is ordered to pay the claimant the gross sum of £394.08.
2. The claimant was dismissed in breach of contract in respect of notice and the 1st respondent is ordered to pay damages to the claimant in the sum of £131.36.
3. The 1st respondent has failed to pay the claimant's holiday entitlement and is ordered to pay the claimant the sum of £328.40.
4. **Pursuant to Section 38 of the Employment Act 2002, the Tribunal being satisfied that the 1st respondent failed to provide the claimant with a written statement of her terms and conditions of employment the 1st respondent is ordered to pay the claimant at the rate of 4 weeks pay in the sum of £535.44.**
5. The proceedings against the 2nd respondent are dismissed following a withdrawal of the claim by the claimant.
6. The hearing listed on 28th September 2020 is cancelled.
