Thank you for your request dated 14 August 2020 in which you asked for the following information from the Ministry of Justice (MoJ):

Under the Freedom of Information Act 2000, please provide me with how much legal aid Duncan Lewis Solicitors received in the years: 2019/2018/2017 And how many legal aid contracts was awarded for each year.

Your request has been handled under the FOIA.

I can confirm that the MoJ holds the information that you have requested. However, the information is exempt from disclosure under section 21 of the FOIA, because it is reasonably accessible to you. The information can be accessed via the following links:

The above notwithstanding, outside the scope of the Act and at our discretion, we have prepared tables from this data showing legal aid payments to Duncan Lewis for the years in question, and these are included below, broken down by either civil or criminal work.

Civil Legal Aid

Note that the figures below only includes payments to the firm include of VAT, but <u>excludes</u> disbursements (payments made to firm on behalf of mainly experts).
