FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000: MINISTRY OF DEFENCE POLICE: STAFF SICKNESS.

We refer to your email dated 21 April 2020 to the Ministry of Defence Police which was acknowledged on the same date.

We are treating your email as a request for information in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA 2000).

In your email you requested the following information:

"I would like to know how many Police Officers and Police Staff reported sick for depression, anxiety, stress or post-traumatic stress between the financial year April 2019 to April 2020, including where the terms 'depression', 'anxiety', 'stress' or 'post-traumatic stress' appear in the description of the illness.

Please could the figure include a split by gender please (e.g Male 110, Female 110, other 110)

Include a breakdown listing the specific illnesses and total work days lost."

A search for information has now been completed by the Ministry of Defence Police and I can confirm that we do hold information in scope of your request.

Between April 2019 and April 2020 the following number of Police Officers and Police Staff reported sick for depression, anxiety, stress or post-traumatic stress.
