You can register as a service voter or as an ordinary voter

The way you choose to register will depend on your personal circumstances. Your unit has a designated Unit Registration Officer who can give you more information. Ask your administration office for contact details.

Registering as a service voter

- If you are in the armed forces or the spouse or registered civil partner of a member of the armed forces, registering as a service voter allows you to be registered for five years at a fixed address in the UK even if you move around. You must renew your application every 5 years, but you can cancel it at any time. Registering as a service voter is particularly useful if you are based overseas or think you may be posted overseas in the next few years.
- If you are under 18 and your parent or guardian is a member of the armed forces and you are
 living with them, you can register as a service voter. You must be living in Scotland or would be living in
 Scotland if your parent or guardian were not based overseas. Your registration must be renewed each
 year and will end when you are 18 years of age. Then you will need to make a new application to register
 reflecting your circumstances at that time. You will be reminded to do so before your eighteenth birthday.

Registering as an ordinary voter

If you are unlikely to be posted overseas or change address in the next year, you can register as an ordinary voter online at **gov.uk/register-to-vote**.

How to register as a service voter

- 1 Fill in this electoral registration form.

- 3 Return your completed form to us at the address shown above.

Registering to vote

You can register to vote if you are:

 Resident (usually live) in Scotland and aged 14 or over (but you will not be able to vote in Scottish Parliamentary or local council elections until you are 16. You will not be able to vote in UK Parliamentary elections until you are 18).

You must also be either:

- A British, Irish or European Union citizen, or
- A Commonwealth citizen or foreign national who has leave to enter or remain in the UK or who does not require such leave.



Your nationality

You can register to vote in the UK if you are a British (including English, Scottish, Welsh or from Northern Ireland), Irish, European Union citizen, or a Commonwealth citizen or foreign national who has leave to enter or remain in the UK or does not require such leave. We may need additional evidence about your nationality or we may check your nationality or immigration status against government records. If you have more than one nationality, please include them all.

Your date of birth

If you don't know your date of birth please give the date you put on official documents (for example, your passport or driving licence) or tick one of the boxes. Your date of birth identifies you and confirms your eligibility to vote.

Changed your name?

For example, you may have got married and changed your name. You do not have to give us details of your name change but it will help us identify you. If this information is not given then you may need to provide additional evidence.

The open register

There are two registers. Why?

Using information received from the public, registration officers keep two registers – the electoral register and the open register (also known as the edited register).

If you are aged 14 or 15, you will not be included on the open register. You will be included on the electoral register, but only Electoral Registration Officers and their staff can usually see the details you provide. Your details will not be included in any register that is published. About six weeks before an election certain people need details of everyone who can vote in that election. If you will be 16 on the date of a Scottish Parliamentary or local council election, your name and address will be given to people who run the elections, and to candidates who want to provide information to voters. You can find out more information about both registers and how they may be used at **gov.uk/register-to-vote**.

If you are concerned that having your name or address on the register may affect your safety, there could be other options available to you. In certain circumstances, you can register without your name and address showing on the register. To find out more, please contact your electoral registration office. Privacy statement

We collect information under the legal basis of a task carried out in the public interest, as set out in the Representation of the People Act 1983 and related regulations. We will look after personal information securely and follow data protection legislation.

If you opted-out of the open register we will only use the information you give us for electoral purposes, including matching it against other sources of data to support the electoral register. We will not give personal information to anyone else, unless we have to by law. The law requires us to share your information with candidates, political parties and campaigners for democratic engagement purposes and credit reference agencies to check your identity when you apply for credit.

If you have <u>not</u> opted-out of the open register your name and address can be bought by anyone and used for lots of purposes, including direct marketing.
