

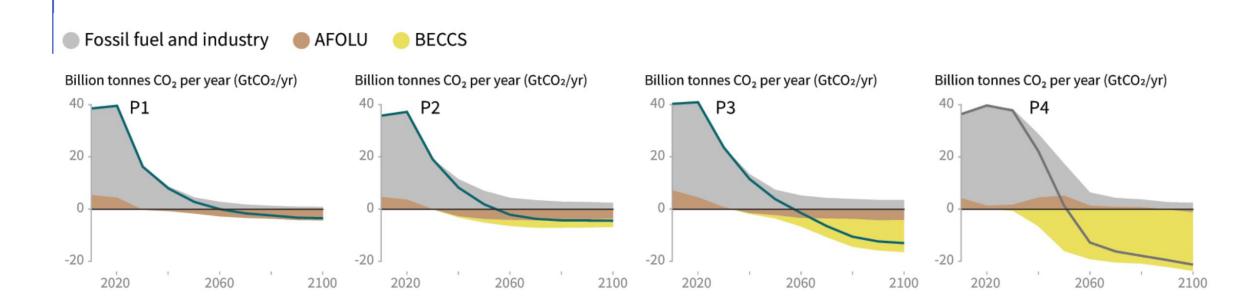
THE ROLE OF GGRS IN NET ZERO: UK GOVERNMENT VIEW

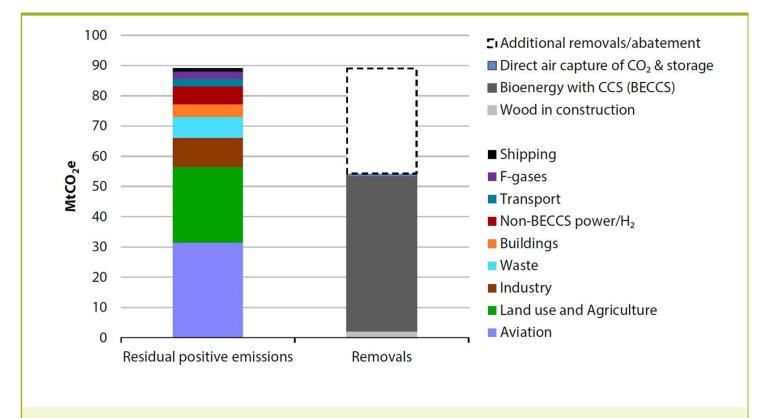
