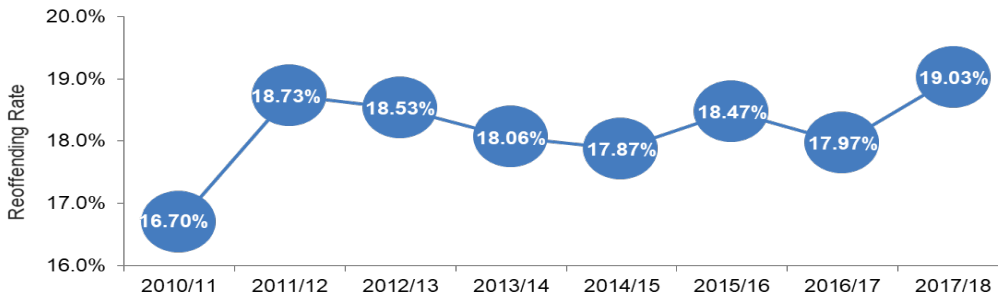
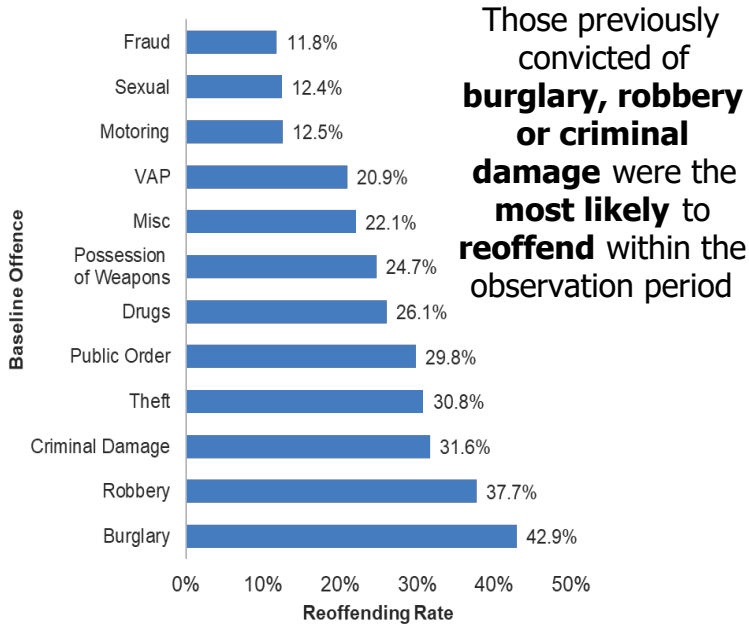


Adult and Youth Reoffending in Northern Ireland (2017/18 Cohort)

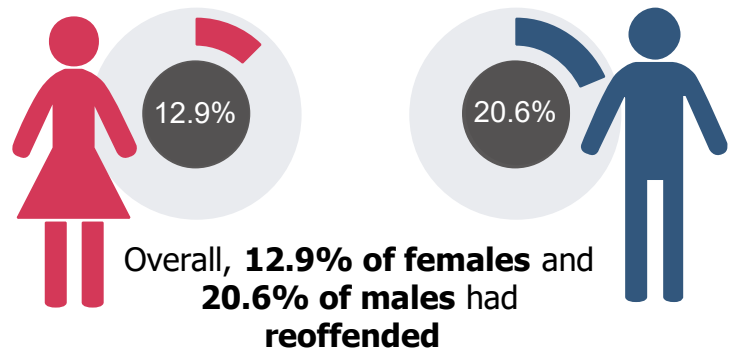
Of the 20,407 people included in the 2017/18 cohort, **3,884 (19.03%) reoffended** during the one year observational period



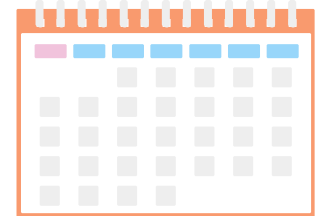
The overall reoffending rate is being used as an indicator for the **Draft Programme for Government** and the **NICS Outcomes Delivery Plan**



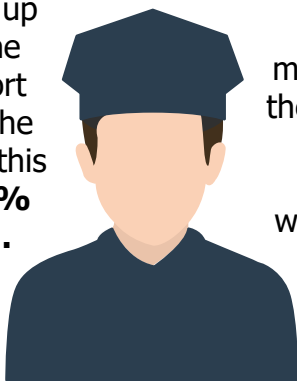
Those previously convicted of **burglary, robbery or criminal damage** were the **most likely to reoffend** within the observation period



Of the reoffenders, **over two-fifths (44.7%)** committed their **first reoffence** within the first three months



Adults make up **94.5%** of the 2017/18 cohort (19,292). Of the **adults** within this cohort, **18.4% reoffended**.



Young people made up **5.5%** of the 2017/18 cohort (1,115). Of the **young people** within this cohort, **29.4% reoffended**.

Custody releases had a reoffending rate of **45.4%**



Diversions disposals had a reoffending rate of **16.6%**

In terms of offending history, **61.2%** of the 20,407 had **committed previous offences** ranging from one to 656 distinct offences
