	Actions	
	Moxon provided an update on the OLE design:	
	They are being created in test yards in Wales and Manchester for testing to be done next 4 years. Network rail are in discussions for the Contractors system	
	which will require a tender for special OLE masts in particular locations. They will be cost neutral.	
	AVDC reminded that landscape issues apply along the line and there should be consistency.

	AVDC advised they felt it should be across the line and not just in the AONB	
	Get copies of DDP printed locally	RGPM
С.	Update from EK on Designs	
	Advised that notice to proceed is December 2019	
	Detailed designs for the Calvert area is starting earlier	
	Meetings are being held with Parishes in July to provide updates	
	They are looking at common design elements for noise barriers	
	Programme of land possession active from July	
	Construction of points off the highways and logistics routes will start end of the year, with more information events in the Great Missenden Area.	
	Wendover Dene	
	Materials are confirmed as weathered steel with a dark matt appearance	
	They advised that they are developing landscaping, reviewing filtration ponds and land drainage to minimise the impact of the ponds, by breaking them up and keeping to contours to minimise land take.	
	They advised they were working on hedgerow patterns where land use changes occurred and slope changes to allow for a landscape led approach.	
	Contour plans and cross sections would be provided as part of schedule 17	
	DDP Adherence: longer span lengths, minimal clutter at base of piers	
	Pier protection through circular area of rock to prevent damage by farming activities	
	Small Dene	
	Terracing landscape features and vehicle restraint barriers	
	There will be a planning application and underpass needed	
	Different vegetation needed on terraces, with harder treatments under the structure, possibly artificial	
	CCB commented that there was some potential with different treatments and could be an interesting concept	
	EK advised the success will be in its simplicity	
	Indicated end of Q4 2019 for planning application	
	Green Tunnel	
	Masked by landscape features, with the portal building looking at weathering steel materials

	South Heath Cutting	
	Noise barrier at Wendover, concerns over views from Coombe Hill	
	Road surface on A413 looking to reduce construction noise and possibly reduce need for noise barrier	
	The cement mix was confirmed as being Portland	
	Wendover Link – the AP was looking unlikely as the land was being restored back to original use and cricket ground retained.	EK
	Maintenance Access Strips were described as 2m strip of grassed maintained access, EK to confirm more detailed designs and if access for PROW could be investigated.	
	Mass-haul was described as being reduced by 10%, advising that intrusive works on Grimms Ditch hadn't started yet, but they were possibly looking to put in a retaining wall.	
D.	Ridgeway Connections Additional Project Sarah Wright from the Ridgeway Partnership talked through the proposal for the AP funding. The HS <sub>2</sub> money would be used to realise the first phase of the Ridgeway Riding route.	RGPM
	Support from RG members to proceed with the project was granted. Also a request from RG members to look if more could be achieved, which SW said she would go and take a look at with the RGPM.	KGPM
	Decluttering the Misbourne Additional Project Discussion CCB explained about the National Grid match funding for applications for decluttering projects. It was felt from RG members that there was overlap with existing AP funding for the Landscape Connectivity project. The application for the feasibility project funding was rejected and advised further details be developed along with Councils reviewing their own signage clutter within the AONB
