Thank you for your email of 27 February 2020 requesting the following information:

- "A list of project and programmes (Business Change / Transformation/ Digital/ Data/Technology).
- A List of the key deliverables/outputs for all project and Programmes (Business Change / Transformation/ Digital/ Data/Technology).
- A List of SROs for project and programmes (Business Change / Transformation/ Digital/ Data/Technology).
- The timelines and stage of delivery (Project stage) for all project and programme (Business Change / Transformation/ Digital/ Data/Technology), including delivery status.
- Current Organisation charts / Organograms for IT, Change & Transformation, Operations and digital data and technology Teams"

We wrote to you on 27 March 2020 advising that we were in the process of conducting a Public Interest Test (PIT), and we would write to you no later than 27 April 2020, with the outcome of the PIT. We then wrote to you on the 27 April applying a further extension stating we will reply no later than 25 May 2020.

We have now completed our PIT, some of the information you have requested can be found attached.

However, some of the information falls entirely within the scope of the absolute exemptions provided for at Section 40 (Personal Data), and the qualified exemptions provided for at Section 24 (National Security), Section 26 (Defence), and Section 43 (Commercial Interests) of the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) and has been redacted.

Section 40(2) has been applied to some of the information in order to protect personal information as governed by the Data Protection Act 1998. Section 40 is an absolute exemption and there is, therefore, no requirement to consider the public interest in making a decision to withhold the information.

Sections 24, 26, 43, are qualified exemptions and are subject to public interest testing, which means that the information requested can only be withheld if the public interest in doing so outweighs the public interest in disclosure.

Section 24 (1) has been applied to some of the information because it contains details that could prejudice national security. Although disclosure would increase public understanding, the balance of public interest lies in withholding some information because its release could be used by those with malicious intent against the UK.

In so far as Section 24(1) applies, we are satisfied that the balance of public interest lies in withholding the information held by the MOD. To provide information in summary of the PIT would in itself harm national security. There is a very strong interest in safeguarding national security; this interest would only be overridden in exceptional circumstances. We have determined that in all the circumstances of the case, the public interest in withholding the information outweighs the public interest in release, and to give a statement of the reasons why the exemption applies would itself involve the disclosure of exempt information.

Section 26(1) (b) has been applied to some of the information because it contains details that are operationally sensitive and would prejudice the capability and effectiveness of our Armed Forces. While releasing the information would provide public awareness of the research work carried out for the future defence of the UK and confidence in associated countermeasures, the balance of public interest was found to be in favour of withholding the information that would prejudice the security of UK personnel and which would provide tactical advantage to our enemies. We have set the level of prejudice against release of the exempted information at the higher level of "would" rather than "would be likely to".

Section 43 (2) has been applied to some of the information because it contains information that would allow the public to determine our commercial position and therefore weaken our ability to negotiate effectively in procuring current services and those in the future to secure value for money. We have set the level of prejudice against release of the exempted information at the higher level of "would" rather than "would be likely to".


