1. Page 3 General Fund
The figure entered for "Amount of general fund at beginning of year" differs from the figure entered for "amount of general fund at end of year" on the previous year's return by £8. This is due to the discovery by current officers of the association of a dormant bank account containing this sum, which had not been included in the previous year's return.
2. Change of accounting policy
Previous returns have included amounts for the honorariums and expenses of some officers of the association which are paid for by the RSPB, rather than being paid out of the association's own funds. These amounts were historically included under lncome (Other income - Income from Federations and other bodies) and Expenditure (Benefits to members / Administrative expenses), with the amounts included under both income and expenditure netting to zero. Having sought clarification from the Certification Office, it has been decided that this "in-kind" contribution to the association should no longer be included in the accounts.
