ONE MONTH CONSULTATION ON THE REVIEW OF THE MARINE GUIDANCE NOTE AND THE METHODOLOGY FOR ASSESSING THE MARINE NAVIGATIONAL RISKS, IN RELATION TO OFFSHORE RENEWABLE ENERGY INSTALLATIONS

The Maritime and Coastguard Agency's (MCA) guidance documents relating to Offshore Renewable Energy Installations underwent a formal 12-week consultation in January 2020. MCA received several comments from representatives from harbour authorities, commercial shipping, recreation, fishing, navigation consultants, Government departments, General Lighthouse Authority and offshore renewable energy developers. We have reviewed all comments received and made amendments to the documents accordingly. We have drafted a second version of MGN543 and Methodology documents and we would like to carry out a second, shorter, consultation. This consultation seeks your comments on a second draft of the following two documents:

1. Revised Marine Guidance Note (MGN) Safety of Navigation: Offshore Renewable Energy Installations (OREIs) – Guidance on UK Navigational Practice, Safety and Emergency Response.

This will replace MGN 543 and is being updated in accordance with current practices, to provide more information on MCA's requirements, and to align with the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) process.

2. Revised Methodology for assessing the Navigational Safety and Emergency Response of Offshore Renewable Energy Installations.

This will replace the existing Methodology document and has been amended to ensure it is more user-friendly and contains updated and relevant information for the development consent application process.

Both documents show the amendments made following comments received to the first consultation, showing in Track Changes. This consultation period will run for 5 weeks. Please send your responses to MCA by email to <u>navigationsafety@mcga.gov.uk</u> by **Friday 29**th **January 2021**.

In addition to the above documents, MCA consulted on Revised Marine Guidance Note (MGN) Safety of Navigation - Guidance to Mariners operating in the vicinity of UK OREIs. This will



replace MGN 372 and is being updated to reflect progress make in the UK offshore renewables industry. This document is not being included as part of a second consultation and the new version, with new MGN number, will be published in the New Year.
