Thank you for your email from 14 November 2020 requesting the following information:

"I was wondering how many personnel serving in the Armed Forces have an epi-pen, and if these could be broken down into Branch and Rank."

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence, and I can confirm that all the information in scope of your request is held.

Please note that EpiPen is a brand of epinephrine autoinjector, therefore to give the most complete picture of this type of prescription, the information in this response includes all epinephrine autoinjectors. If you require only prescriptions for EpiPens, please let us know.

As at 1 October 2020, **155** UK armed forces personnel in service had a current prescription for an epinephrine autoinjector (Table 1). An epinephrine autoinjector prescription was considered current if it was made within the previous 18 months.

Under Section 16 (Advice and Assistance) you may find it useful to note the following:

Personnel include all UK armed forces regular and reservist personnel. This does not include entitled or non-entitled civilians, foreign service or non-UK military. This response relates to all personnel who were in service as at 1 October 2020.

Reservist personnel were included. However, please note that the majority of reservist personnel receive their primary medical care from the NHS. Any prescriptions entered in an NHS record will therefore not be included in the figures presented for the number of personnel with a prescription entered into their MOD medical record.

Information on epinephrine autoinjector prescriptions was derived from the Defence Medical Information Capability Programme (DMICP). DMICP has a centralised data warehouse of Read coded information. It is the source of electronic, integrated healthcare records for primary healthcare and some MOD specialist care providers from which searches can be run.

The following terms were used to search within the DMICP data warehouse for epinephrine autoinjector prescriptions:

- EpiPen
- EpiPen Junior
- Jext
- Emerade
- Anapen

DMICP is a live data source and is subject to change. Date of extract 25 November 2020.

Advice from pharmacist Subject Matter Experts is that epinephrine autoinjectors expire within approximately 18 months of issue from a pharmacy. Prescriptions made prior to 1 April 2019 (18 months from 1 October 2020) therefore not considered current and were not included in the information provided.

Please note, it is not possible to determine from the centrally held database whether the epinephrine autoinjectors have been used.
