## **Consultation on a revision to Harbour Order application fees**

I am writing to invite views on proposals to revise the fee structure for Harbour Orders (HO) processed by the Marine Management Organisation (MMO) on behalf of the Department for Transport (DfT). HO have been administered by MMO since 2010, through a delegated function from DfT. The DfT and the MMO are jointly seeking your views.

Current fees for applications do not reflect the actual costs to the MMO in determining HO applications nor do they recognise the increased complexity of these applications. The fee structure was last updated 25 years ago in 1994. The consultation is seeking views on options to revise the fee structure.

This consultation document is directed at Local Harbour Authorities and anyone interested in, or involved with harbour activities that take place in England and the Port of Milford Haven (a reserved trust port).
