

PROVISION OF REQUESTED INFORMATION

Thank you for your request for information regarding pet imports which we received on 19 February 2020. Your request has been handled under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOI).

The information you requested and our response is detailed below:

"May I request the following information:-

- How many dog, cats and ferrets have entered the UK via the Pet Travel Service(PETS)
 - 1.1. for years 2016-current
 - 1.2. Broken down by pet type and month.
- Of those pets that have passed through PETS how many have not been compliant for entry?
 - 2.1. For years 2016-current
 - 2.2. Broken down by pet type and month
- 3. Of those pets not compliant, the pet owner is given a form showing the reason for non compliance. From this form I can see there are approx. 38 reasons for failure
 - 3.1. For years 2016-current
 - 3.2. Can each of these 38 reasons be grouped by reason and displayed by month/year"

Please see the information you have requested at Appendix 1.

The data regarding the Pet Travel Scheme (PETS) covers pets entering Great Britain and is based on information provided by checkers employed by approved carriers of pet animals. The information that APHA have provided is a true reflection of the information that we have access to. APHA can't guarantee the accuracy of this data, as we can only rely on the information that has been input into the pets returns by a third party.

APHA is an Executive Agency of the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs and also works on behalf of the Scottish Government, Welsh Government and Food Standards Agency to safeguard animal and plant health for the benefit of people, the environment and the economy.

Please note that animals moving under PETS can have multiple non-compliances recorded against them. So the data provided for failure reasons does not cover the number of animals, but the number of non-compliances recorded. Please also note that this does not necessarily mean that the animal was refused entry as there are a number of minor non-compliances for which the pet can still travel. The failure reasons are updated regularly which is why the data for some years is split.

Information disclosed in response to this FOI request is releasable to the public. In keeping with the spirit and effect of the FOI and the government's Transparency Agenda, this letter and the information disclosed to you may be placed on GOV.UK, together with any related information that will provide a key to its wider context. No information identifying you will be placed on the GOV.UK website.
