## JUDGMENT

The claimant's claims are dismissed as not well founded.

## REASONS

The claimant agreed that he had been paid for all work done. The claimant explained that his claim arose from the difficulty he was having with claiming universal credit after his employment with the respondent ended. This is not something that could result in a finding that an unlawful deduction from his wages had occurred, which is what he sought to claim. Accordingly, the claimant's claim was dismissed.
