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Animal Health Attestation

I, the undersigned official* veterinarian, authorised by the competent authority, certify that the animals described in Part 1 meet the following requirements:

1. The territory described in boxes I.7. and I.8 is an OIE member country;
2. They have remained in the territory described in boxes I.7. and I.8. since birth, or they were imported into that country either
(a) directly from _____, an EU Member State*, or,
(b) from _____, a third country under the conditions at least as strict as those set out in this certificate*;
3. The holding of origin described in box I.11 is not subject to animal health or animal welfare official controls or restrictions;
4. They are not intended to be killed under a national control programme to eradicate disease;
5. They come from a holding in the country of origin that is under veterinary supervision;
6. They were examined by an authorised veterinarian within 48 hours of loading and showed no clinical sign of disease, nor is there reason to suspect they have been exposed to an infectious disease prior to dispatch, and were deemed fit for the intended journey.
7. I have received a written declaration from the responsible person stating that the animals will not be released into the wild at any time in Ireland.

Animal transport attestation

I, undersigned official* veterinarian, authorised by the competent authority, hereby certify, that:

1. The animals described above have been treated before and during the time of loading in accordance with the relevant provisions of Council Regulation (EC) No 1/2005 or of recognised international standards for transport of animals, in particular as regards watering, feeding and the use of the transport container and they are fit for the intended transport;
2. The person in charge of the transport of animals submitted signed written statement, which proved that suitable arrangements have been made for the feeding, watering and care of the animals during transport in accordance with the international standards recognised for transport of animals;
3. A correctly registered transporter will be used to transport these animals to Ireland*;
4. Any transport box or container in which the animals are loaded into, is used for the first time or it has been cleaned and disinfected before loading with an officially authorised disinfectant;
5. the animals have been loaded for dispatch to Ireland into the means of transport described above, which have been so constructed that faeces, urine, litter or fodder could not flow or fall out of the vehicle or container during transportation.

Notes:

This certificate is valid for 10 days from the date of its issue until the date of documentary and identity checks carried out at the first Border Control Post of entry to the European Union. In the case of transport by sea, the validity of the certificate is extended by the additional period corresponding to the duration of the journey by sea.

*For the commercial exports of live vertebrates from Great Britain to the Republic of Ireland, OV's should check that the transporter holds valid "type 2" transporter authorisations issued by APHA and by an EU member state and that the vehicle has been inspected and certified as suitable for the particular species needs.
