Acknowledgement of Service - Template guidance

This is available for those solicitors who are representing the respondent but are unable to respond digitally. You can complete a paper AOS that is only used in Digital Divorces and ensures the divorce is maintained on the digital path rather than being transferred to paper.

In order to respond to the divorce petition on behalf of your client, you will need to download and complete an acknowledgement of service template by emailing HMCTSFinancialRemedy@justice.gov.uk. Once complete, you will be able to send the AOS to the Courts and Tribunals Service Centre, alongside your Notice of Acting by emailing:
