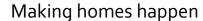
Thank you for your recent email, which was processed under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA). You requested the following information:

- 1. How many bids in total have been received under the Shared Ownership and Affordable Homes Programme 2016 to 2021 for building Traveller sites?
- 2. How many of those bids were successful and which local authority / RSLs were they from?
- 3. Of the successful bids, how many Traveller pitches does that amount to, in total and broken down into each successful applicant? Please stipulate if they were for transit or permanent pitches in each case.
- 4. Of the successful bids awarded funding for Traveller sites under the SOAHP, how many of those pitches have actually been built and are now in use?
- 5. Of the successful bids, how many pitches are additional to their current provision and how many are replacing/renovating existing pitches?

Response

We can confirm that we do hold the requested information.

- 1. How many bids in total have been received under the Shared Ownership and Affordable Homes Programme 2016 to 2021 for building Traveller sites?
 - There have been 5 bids through the 16-21 SOAHP Programme for traveller sites.
- 2. How many of those bids were successful and which local authority / RSLs were they from?2 schemes have been allocated funding. One in Birmingham and one in Cornwall.
- Of the successful bids, how many Traveller pitches does that amount to, in total and broken down into each successful applicant? Please stipulate if they were for transit or permanent pitches in each case.
 units in Cornwall and 15 in Birmingham. All new build Transit.





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4. Of the successful bids awarded funding for Traveller sites under the SOAHP, how many of those pitches have actually been built and are now in use?
