# RE: Request for Information – RFI3389

Thank you for your recent email, which was processed under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA). You requested the following information:

*New permitted development right to allow existing free standing purpose-built residential blocks of 3 storeys or more to extend upwards by two storeys to create new homes'* 

I would like to submit a FOI request to find out how many applications have been successful and approved under the above legislation since its inception last year. Town and Country Planning (General Permitted Development) (England) Order 2015 (as amended) New permitted development right to allow existing free standing purpose-built residential blocks of 3 storeys or more to extend upwards by two storeys to create new homes. I understand from Paul Martin (Planning Development Management |Planning Directorate |Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government |3rd Floor, Fry Building, 2 Marsham Street, London SW1P 4DF) that Ministers are monitoring the 'impact' and keeping it under 'review' – I am keen to understand the data that Ministers are being provided with to undertake the 'review' and 'impact' hence this FOI request.

### **Response**

We are able to confirm that Homes England does not hold the information detailed in your request. This is because there is no legal or business reason for Homes England to do so.

The FOIA does not oblige a public authority to create information to answer a request if the requested information is not held. The duty under section 1(1) is only to provide the recorded information held.

Your request for review must be made in writing, explain why you wish to appeal, and be received within 40 working days of the date of this response. Failure to meet this criteria may lead to your request being refused.

Upon receipt, your request for review will be passed to an independent party not involved in your original request. We aim to issue a response within 20 working days.

You may also complain to the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) however, the Information Commissioner does usually expect the internal review procedure to be exhausted in the first instance.
