PROVISION OF REQUESTED INFORMATION

Thank you for your request for information regarding the live animal trade which we received on 2 June 2020. Your request has been handled under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOI).

The information you requested and our response is detailed below:

"I would like to enquire whether it is possible to obtain information on amphibian, reptile and fish trading routes from 2014 to present? In particular, I am interested in the species, import and export country (and origin country if available), reported quantities being transported and the type of transport (live, eggs, specimens etc.) if possible?"

The Animal and Plant Health Agency (APHA) cannot provide any data regarding amphibians, reptiles and fish moving between the UK and the EU as these species do not require a health certificate to move between EU countries.

TRACES (Trade Control and Expert System) is a European Commission system employed by EU member states to facilitate and record animal/animal product movements into and throughout the EU. The data for imports from non-EU countries was extracted from TRACES, and covers the number of animals imported. The information that we have provided is a true reflection of the information that we have access to. We can't guarantee the accuracy of this data, as we can only rely on the information that has been input into TRACES by a third party. TRACES only holds data as far back as 2015.

APHA issues Export Health Certificates (EHC) for animals and products of animal origin. The data for exports to non-EU countries covers the number of EHCs issued. APHA does not record the number of animals or the species travelling on each EHC. APHA only issues an EHC if required by the destination country. We have not issued any EHCs for reptiles and amphibians other than one off pet movements. APHA's data retention period for export certification is two years so APHA no longer hold any records for export consignments carried out prior to 2018.

APHA is an Executive Agency of the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs and also works on behalf of the Scottish Government, Welsh Government and Food Standards Agency to safeguard animal and plant health for the benefit of people, the environment and the economy.

Information disclosed in response to this FOI request is releasable to the public. In keeping with the spirit and effect of the FOI and the government's Transparency Agenda, this letter and the information disclosed to you may be placed on GOV.UK, together with any related information that will provide a key to its wider context.
