Following my letters of 16 February and 15 March, in relation to your Freedom of Information (FOI) request for:

details held by your department regarding the RMP/SIB investigation into the alleged abuse of prisoners and validity of images published by The Mirror/Piers Morgan. Please provide the complete copy of the report the RMP investigation carried out and any details of the outcome of the report. Including all images used in connection with the alleged/faked incident.

A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence, and I can confirm that some information in scope of your request is held. As I informed you in my previous letter, information in scope of your request engaged the gualified exemption: Section 30 (Investigations). This related to the 'complete copy of the [RMP] report'. As such it was necessary for us to decide whether, in all the circumstances of the case, the public interest in maintaining the exemption outweighs the public interest in disclosure.

The public interest test considered whether release of this information could compromise future proceedings. It was decided on balance that due to the age and status of the investigation this was unlikely and therefore the RMP report has been released and is attached below.

Section 40(2) (Personal data) has been applied to some of the information you have requested, including parts of the report and the 'outcome of the report', in order to protect personal information as governed by the Data Protection Act 2018. Section 40 is an absolute exemption and there is therefore no requirement to consider the public interest in making a decision to withhold the information.

The part of your request which asks for 'all images used in connection with the alleged/faked incident' has been scoped as the images from the alleged incident, which were investigated as a result of the Daily Mirror story. These consisted of the photos which were published in the Daily Mirror. The photos are attached below.

If you have any queries regarding the content of this letter, please contact this office in the first instance. If you wish to complain about the handling of your request, or the content of this response, you can request an independent internal review by contacting the Information Rights Compliance team, Ground Floor, MOD Main Building, Whitehall, SW1A 2HB (e-mail CIO-FOI-IR@mod.gov.uk). 1. <u>Background to Case</u>. Further to this unit's Interim Investigation Summary of even reference, dated 14 Jun 04. It will be recalled that a number of outstanding enquiries remained to be completed in order to bring the investigation to a conclusion. Those enquiries, with the exception of expert dermatology, are now concluded and are summarised below.

### EVIDENCE

2. <u>Expert Analysis</u>. In an attempt to prove conclusively that the photographs depicting the alleged abuse of an Iraqi published in the Daily Mirror on 1 & 3 May 04 were false and that the photograph depicting Soldier A published on 3 May 04 was in fact where the equipment & clothing in those photographs. Additionally the services of a skin expert was sought to compare the distinctive moles on the left arm of Soldier A with a photograph of the equipment. The results of those outstanding expert comparisons are as follow:

Desert Combats. The two sets of desert combat clothing recovered during the search of tresidence in Fabrics and Finishes, DCIPT, DLO Caversfield

and Audio/Video Forensics, Stockport, Manchester. The conclusion drawn by both experts remains at variance. When re-interviewed, the recovered clothing and the combat whilst there were some similarities in the pattern of the recovered clothing and the combat clothing worn in the Iraqi abuse photographs (as highlighted by Audio/Forensics) they were not the same garments. The published photographs together with a selection of comparison photographs provided by Audio/Forensics are included in the photographic forwarded with this report.



b. <u>Distinctive Markings</u>. Despite the above findings, it was evident from examination of the combat shirt worn by the soldier in the Iraqi abuse photographs that there was markings on the underside of the rank slide enaulette on the front of the shirt, which appeared to bear the letters the letters the letters were found to be present on the rank slide enaulette of both shirts recovered from the from RTMC Chilwell stated that all reservists were issued with two sets of desert combats. The the letters did not hold or issue any desert pattern uniform.

c. <u>Weapons Expert.</u> SA80 A2 Fielding Team, Donnington identified the rifle depicted in the Iraqi abuse photographs as being a genuine SA80 A1. The main identifying points were the presence of a Radway Green (RG) magazine denoted by a plastic base plate and seam running down the front. The A2 rifle by comparison, has a flat steel plate on the bottom and no seams on the body. All RG magazines have been withdrawn with the introduction and issue of the A2 rifle, however, Preston still holds A1 rifles and RG magazines. A further distinguishing feature of the A1 rifle is that the gas cylinder is shiny whereas on the A2 it is painted black. A copy of performance peoprt is attached at Annex LL.

d. <u>Dermatology</u>. Expert comparison of the distinctive moles present on the left arm of Soldier A and the photographs taken of **Dermatology** is being conducted by **Dermatology**. Glasgow University. The results of this examination are awaited and will be made known to entitled addressees in due course.

e. <u>Ammunition</u>. During the search of **Second Presidence** on Fri 14 May 04, 3 x 20 round boxes of 5.56mm blank ammunition were found amongst personal possessions. It was confirmed by **Second Presidence** 521 Sqn, 11 EOD Regt RLC, that these rounds were of British origin, MOD issue, manufactured by Radway Green in 2003.

### INTERVIEW WITH SUSPECT

3. On Thu 15 Jul 04, was re-interviewed after caution in the presence of solicitor. declined to answer any questions regarding the production and subsequent publication of the stories and photographs in the Daily Mirror. Regarding the recovered blank ammunition, did admit that had unwittingly left a range in possession of the 60 rounds of blank ammunition during a training weekend (Haslingden Weekend), in Apr 04. Claimed to have found the rounds in day-sack during the weekend of 1-2 May 04 whilst packing to depart on

4. <u>Weapon Issue</u>. As such soldier B and the 'victim' depicted in the Iraqi abuse photographs remain to date, unidentified.
