Re: Grant Determination Letter for Devolution of the Adult Education Budget for Financial Year 2021-22 (DfE Grant Reference: AEBDEVO-21-22)

This Determination is made between:

(1) The Secretary of State for Education and

(2) The Mayor of London

This letter confirms the amount of delegated Adult Education Budget (AEB) you will receive in the financial year (FY) 2021-22 (1 April 2021 to 31 March 2022) to deliver relevant adult education functions in your delegated area.

Payment arrangements

Your total delegated AEB for FY 2021-22 is **£323,611,136** as set out in the table on page 2 and will be provided to the Greater London Authority on your behalf.

We are providing this grant as a non-ring-fenced transfer under Section 39A of the Greater London Authority Act 1999 and have copied this grant letter to the Chief Finance Officer of the Greater London Authority.

In addition, Annex A provides details on all the devolved AEB payments to be made to specified Mayoral Combined Authorities in the FY 2021-22 and is included for completeness.
