PROVISION OF REQUESTED INFORMATION

Thank you for your request for information on bovine abortions which we received on 23 July 2020. Your request has been handled under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOI).

The information you requested and our response is detailed below:

I would like to request the following information:

- 1) The total number of bovine abortions reported to APHA in England and Wales (as required under the respective Brucellosis Orders) for each of the following years: 2017, 2018, and 2020 (if available).
- 2) The total number of statutory abortion enquiries authorised by APHA and carried out by official veterinarians in England and Wales for the same years.

This information has been exempted from release citing Section 43 of the Freedom of information Act (FOIA), details below.

Section 43

Section 43(2) of the FOIA exempts information if its disclosure under the Act would or would be likely to prejudice the commercial interests of any person. The exemption in Section 43 is subject to a Public Interest Test to ensure it is being appropriately applied.

Public Interest Test

APHA recognise that there is a general presumption in favour of openness and transparency concerning our work, and providing the general public with the right to request access to information held by public authorities.

APHA also recognise that this would increase transparency and aid well-informed debates concerning our work.

However the VDP contracts will be retendered later this year and bovine abortion enquiries fall within the scope of those contracts.

Providing this data at the granular level of VDP region in advance of the publication of that Initiation to Tender (ITT) may provide a competitive advantage. The ITT will include historical volumes for all the tendered services.

APHA have concluded that, in all the circumstances of the case, the information should be withheld under Section 43(3) of the Act at this time.
