"Alongside an expanded Seasonal Workers Pilot, we are working with industry partners to build on the success of last year's Pick for Britain campaign and help our farmers make long-term improvements to their domestic recruitment pipelines. At the same time, our review into automation will pave the way for a pioneering and efficient future for our fruit and vegetable growers."

## **Background briefing**

## **On Pick for Britain success**

• The success of the Pick for Britain campaign meant that industry needs were met last year and there was a strong interest in opportunities across the country – which is testament to the many British workers who stepped up to the challenge.

• Seasonal workers are essential to bringing in the harvest every year, and Pick for Britain helped growers find the workers they need despite the impacts of the coronavirus crisis last year.

## On domestic recruitment this year

• This year we're continuing to build on the success of last year's Pick for

Britain Campaign by promoting domestic recruitment, though we won't be running a national campaign under the Pick for Britain brand. Last year's campaign was a response to COVID-19 risks, and we now need to look at supporting long-term improvements to recruitment pipelines for edible sectors.

• Feedback from growers and other industry organisations was clear that removing barriers to local and regional recruitment was the most effective way to support domestic recruitment. We're working with DWP and industry partners to take meaningful action in this way.

• The Government is encouraging the sector to make employment more attractive to UK domestic workers through offering training, careers options, wage increases and to invest in increased automation technology.

# On the Seasonal Workers Pilot

• The Seasonal Workers Pilot, originally launched in 2019, has been extended and expanded for an additional year from 10,000 to 30,000 visas, granted for workers to come to the UK, from EU or non-EU countries, for a period of up to 6 months to pick and package fruit and vegetables on our farms.

• The expanded Seasonal Workers Pilot for this year will continue to operate in the edible horticulture sector. This is the sector of agriculture which has been experiencing the most severe seasonal labour shortages, and which the Seasonal Workers Pilot aims to support to ensure critical food supply chains in the UK are maintained.

• The expansion of the Pilot for 2021 will allow us to further test how this Pilot operates, whilst helping farmers and growers adjust to changes to the labour market, and to ease some of the pressure felt on farms when they are at their busiest.

• The Extended Pilot for 2021 will be managed by four pilot operators, and Defra is currently seeking two new operators to join the current operators - Concordia and Pro-Force Limited - subject to Home Office approval.

• The Seasonal Workers Pilot opened in 2019 and was designed to test the effectiveness of our immigration system at supporting UK growers during peak production periods, whilst maintaining robust immigration control, and ensuring the welfare of participating migrant workers. It also provides a valuable source of labour for the UK's fruit and vegetable growers helping to make sure that all that we grow in this country gets onto our supermarket shelves.

## On the future of the Pilot

• The UK has a highly resilient food supply chain and we are continuing to work hard to ensure our farmers and growers have the support and workforce they need.

• We are working closely with the Home Office to ensure there is a long term strategy for the food and farming workforce beyond 2021.
