



# Regulation of school managers and governors: prohibition direction

**Name:** Jamshed Javeed

**Former position:** Science teacher, Sharples School, Bolton

**Prescribed grounds on which the direction has been issued:**

Under section 128 of the Education and Skills Act 2008, the “appropriate authority” (in this case the Secretary of State) may give a direction prohibiting a person from taking part in the management of an independent school on prescribed grounds connected with the person’s suitability. The grounds on which a person may be prohibited are prescribed in the Independent Education Provision in England (Prohibition from Participation in Management) Regulations 2014.

A direction was given in respect of Jamshed Javeed on 4 June 2021. The Secretary of State found that Mr Javeed had:

- been convicted of a relevant offence; and
- engaged in relevant conduct

and that because of this he is unsuitable to take part in the management of an independent school (including an academy or Free School). The direction also has the effect of disqualifying Mr Javeed from being a governor at a maintained school.

## Summary

Mr Javeed has been convicted of relevant offences, namely engaging in conduct in preparation for terrorist acts contrary to section 5 of the Terrorism Act 2000. These convictions led to his indefinite prohibition from teaching activities. In the opinion of the Secretary of State these offences are also relevant to Mr Javeed’s suitability to take part in the management of an independent school.
