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#### 1. Introduction

- 1.1 In our Decision Statement on the introduction of fees<sup>1</sup> we committed to publishing information on our budget each financial year including the split between grant in aid from our sponsor department, Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government, and fee revenue; the cost of key functions and the fee level for the year. Our budget for activities currently supported by the fees regime for 2021/22 is set out below.
- 1.2 Fee income is generated from a mixture of annual fees, which cover routine regulation, and initial registration fees. Grant in aid covers the cost of non-routine regulation, including our current consumer regulation role, and any registration costs not covered by initial registration fees<sup>2</sup>.
- 1.3 We formed a Fees and Resources Advisory Panel<sup>3</sup> alongside existing stakeholder engagement arrangements to enable engagement on fees with a range of stakeholders, and to provide increased transparency.



#### 5. Fee levels 2021-22

Registered providers <1,000 units	£300 flat fee per annum
Registered providers >1,000 units	£5.36 per social housing unit
Initial registration fee	£2,500

5.1 There is allowance in the above costs to allow for additional planned recruitment. Should there be any underspend on fee-funded costs there would be a proportionate rebate of the annual fee to registered providers with more than 1,000 units.
