

THE OFFSHORE COMBUSTION INSTALLATIONS (POLLUTION PREVENTION AND CONTROL) REGULATIONS 2013 (AS AMENDED) ("THE OFFSHORE (PPC) REGULATIONS 2013")

FORM OF PUBLIC NOTICE

The Department for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy (BEIS) has received requests for the Secretary of State to exercise his powers under Regulation 10(1) of the Offshore Combustion Installations (Pollution Prevention and Control) Regulations 2013 (as amended). Operators that have made such derogation requests in respect of the Best Available Techniques (BAT) Reference Document for Large Combustion Plants are listed in the table below. In addition, details of the installation and permit reference numbers are provided.
