

Key Facts 2020/21



Purpose

This is a supplementary document combining key facts from the previously released 2020/21 publications relating to the four main areas within Family Practitioner Services.

They represent a range of general medical, dental, ophthalmic and pharmaceutical services, and the statistics are based on registration activity and claims submitted from within primary care to the Business Services Organisation (BSO). They do not cover secondary and private care.

Introduction

This publication provides key facts in relation to general medical, dental, ophthalmic and pharmaceutical services and statistics in Northern Ireland between April 2020 and March 2021. It is a supplementary document summarising each of the standalone reports previously published in June 2021. These full reports are available to download from the <u>HSC website</u> and provide detail on the definitions and sources of the information presented in this summary compendium. They also highlight the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic on activity levels in this most recent year.

This publication is based on payment claims submitted by primary care dentists and opticians, community pharmacists, dispensing doctors and appliance suppliers to Family Practitioner Services (FPS). The information does not include private work and secondary care activity.

General medical information is based on patient records on the National Health Application and Infrastructure Services (NHAIS) system, the Common Practitioner Model (CPM) but does not contain data on the treatment of patients which is not available to BSO.

This publication has been produced by independent statisticians within the FPS Information Unit. They are on secondment from the Northern Ireland Statistics and Research Agency (NISRA). It has been compiled in accordance with the Code of Practice for Statistics.

General Medical Services



- There were 321 active GP practices in Northern Ireland on 31 March 2021 An 8% decrease (or 29 practices) since 2014.
- There were 1,410 registered GPs (excluding Locums) Of these 58% were female and 42% were male, a shift in gender profile from 2014 (46% / 54%).
- More than 2 million registered patients This included 44,000 new patient registrations and approximately 40,000 patients deducted.
- BSO processed £316.9m of payments towards the cost of GP Services The average payment per registered patient was £158, an increase of £15 per patient since 19/20.

Dental Services



There were 368 health service dental practices in Northern Ireland on 31 March 2021

A reduction of 4 practices compared to 19/20

- There were 1,142 registered dentists
 - An increase of 19% since 2011.
- The number of patients registered with a health service dentist was approximately 1.25m

This was 65% of the Northern Ireland population.

The gross cost of dental services in 2020/21 was £131.7m This included £51.9m in Covid-19 Support Payments and £7.1m in patient contributions.

Ophthalmic Services



There were 271 ophthalmic practices carrying out health service eye tests in Northern Ireland on 31 March 2021

4.2% higher than in 2014 however this figure has remained stable over the last 4 years.

- There were 665 registered ophthalmic practitioners An increase of 3% on 19/20.
- The total number of health service eye tests carried out was 311,000 For every 4 tests, 3 were for patients under 16 or 60 years old and over.
- The total cost for ophthalmic services in 2020/21 was £24.4m A 3% increase on 19/20. This included £7.6m in Covid-19 Support Payments.

Pharmaceutical Services




- There were 528 pharmacies in Northern Ireland on 31 March 2021 A reduction of three pharmacies on 19/20.
- There were 41.7m items dispensed (all contractors) A decrease of 3.1% on 19/20.
- There were 41.4m items dispensed (pharmacies only) An average of 78,286 items per pharmacy, a decrease of 2.9% on 19/20.
- The total ingredient cost for all items dispensed in Northern Ireland was £454.3m

An increase of 2.3% on 19/20.


Just under 2,007,000 patients were registered with a GP practice.

The number of patients registered at a GP practice in NI has increased by 4% from 2014.

Average number of patients per practice was 6,252.

98% of the population lived within 5 miles of a GP practice, 88% live within 3 miles.

New (first time in NI) GP Registrations by UK Nationals and non-UK Nationals, by LGD






Patients

There were 74% of females registered with a dentist compared to 58% of males in the 18-44 age group.

94% of the population lived within 5 miles of a dental practice.

Almost 290,000 adults were seen, a decrease of 60% on 19/20.

Over 51,000 children received dental treatment in excess of the basic treatments covered under capitation, a drop of 57% on 19/20.







Patients

95% of the population lived within 5 miles of an ophthalmic practice.
57% of all sight tests carried out were on female patients.
49% of all sight tests carried out were for patients aged 60 or over.
30,555 unique patient assessments were carried out at NI PEARS, a 22% increase on 19/20. 80% of these were new assessments.



Number of Pharmacies and Average Monthly Volume of Dispensed Prescription Items





Patients

Over 99% of the population lived within 5 miles of a community pharmacy.

72.5% of all people lived within 1 mile of their nearest pharmacy.

Derry City & Strabane LGD had the highest number of items dispensed per person at 27.2 whilst Lisburn and Castlereagh were the lowest at 16.8 items. The NI average was 21.8 items per person.







Family Practitioner Services

Family Practitioner Services (FPS) is part of the Business Services Organisation's (BSO) Operations Directorate. It provides a range of essential services to Health and Social Care organisations, primary care contractors and patients.

FPS calculates payments to health professionals in the dental, pharmacy, general medical and ophthalmic sectors through Northern Ireland. It also maintains the central register of patients registered with GP Practices in Northern Ireland, issuing medical cards and processing changes such as name, address and doctor.

It provides professional advice, support and information to customers and members of the public and maintains the pharmaceutical, dental and the Northern Ireland Primary Medical Performers lists. FPS also provides the call and recall services for breast, cervical and bowel cancer screening in Northern Ireland.

About this publication

This report has been produced by independent statisticians within the FPS Information Unit. They are on secondment from the Northern Ireland Statistics and Research Agency (NISRA). This publication has been compiled in accordance with the Code of Practice for Statistics. Next edition

This compendium publication is issued annually. It is expected that the next edition shall be published end-June/early-July following the next release of the individual annual reports in June 2022. Technical Notes

Target Audience

The target audience for this publication has been defined as: the Department of Health, HSC Board and Trusts in Northern Ireland, health professionals, academics, HSC Stakeholders, the media and the general public.

Main usages

This publication contains official statistics on general medical, dental, ophthalmic and pharmaceutical activity for the most recent financial year (and earlier years where available on a comparable basis). It provides a board overview of activity across the service areas, highlighting where more details breakdowns, can be obtained.

The detailed information underpinning this summary can be used to support decision making, inform policy, provide advice to ministers, answer a wide range of Assembly Questions and Freedom of Information requests, for national and local press articles and, where appropriate, for international comparison.

Data Quality Summary

The data has been primary sourced from the Family Practitioner Payment System (FPPS) in respect of FPS activity and payment information. Resident population data has been sourced from official NISRA demographic statistics.

The FPPS is a business critical payment system which is subject to periodic audit. The data quality is assessed as very good based on the low percentage of claims which have to be adjusted following payment.

As an administrative data system, there will inevitably be some manual entry errors and, even for automated processes, there may be errors within the claims submitted by primary care contractors.

The extensive validation that occurs prior to payments being made, coupled with the consistency and variance checks carried out during the compilation of this publication means that the data provides a good representation of FPS activity for the years covered by the report.
