Speech by Bryan Dyson, former CEO of Coke Cola

Majority of Phase 1 fieldwork to complete in 2022, Phase 2a approx. 2026.



Enabling Works Contractors (CSjv, Fusion and LM) delivering up to and including post-excavation assessment.



Small-scale fieldwork beyond 2022, e.g. historic building recording and construction integrated recording, to be carried out by Main Works Contractors and their supply chain.



EWCs and MWCs are not delivering the post-excavation analysis phase.

Analysis phase



The EWCs and MWCs are structured organisationally and commercially to deliver a range of **site-based** construction activities, including archaeological fieldwork.



Different structures are needed to deliver the unique range of activities that comprise post-excavation services.




The Phase 1 and 2a post-excavation programme is estimated to take 6-7 years. The EWC contracts are programmed for closure during that period.
