REPORT OF THE INDEPENDENT AUDITORS TO THE MEMBERS OF THE BRITISH ASSOCIATION OF DENTAL NURSES

Opinion

Auditors' responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue a Report of the Auditors that includes our opinion. 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" including the provisions of Section 1A "Small Entities". The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income and expenditure

Subscription income is recognised when it is received. All other income and expenditure is recognised as it is earned or incurred, not as it is received or paid.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Fixtures and fittings	-	20% on cost
Computer equipment	-	Straight line over 3 years

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to surplus or deficit on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The association operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the association's pension scheme are charged to the profit and loss account in the period to which they relate.

Intangible fixed assets

Trademarks are stated at cost initially and then amortised over their economic lives of 20 years. Expenditure on the website is recorded at cost initially and then amortised over its economic life of 5 years.

Investments

Investments are stated at cost.
