The NHS COVID Pass letter says you have had your COVID vaccination.




The NHS COVID Pass letter is important. Keep it safe.

What is on the front of the NHS COVID Pass letter if you had a 2 dose vaccine





When could I be asked to show my NHS COVID Pass letter?

You may be asked to show the letter when you travel abroad.



Is there a digital version of my NHS COVID Pass letter?

A **digital version** is a version you can look at on a computer or phone.



You can use the NHS App to see a digital version of the NHS COVID Pass letter and your vaccination information.



What should I do if I lose my NHS COVID Pass letter?

The NHS COVID Pass letter is important. Keep it safe.

It is proof you have been vaccinated.

Can I get the NHS COVID Pass letter in other languages, large print or braille?

Yes. Call 119 for free.
