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II.1 Public health attestation for aquatic animals and products thereof I, the undersigned, declare that I am aware of the relevant provisions of Regulations (EC) No 178/2002, (EC) No 852/2004, (EC) No 853/2004 and (EC) No 854/2004 and certify that the aquatic animals or products thereof for human consumption described above were produced in accordance with those requirements, in particular that they:

- come from (an) establishment(s) implementing a programme based on the HACCP principles in accordance with Regulation (EC) No 852/2004;
- have been harvested, where necessary relayed and transported in accordance with Section VII, Chapters I and II of Annex III to Regulation (EC) No 853/2004;
- were handled, where necessary purified, and packaged in compliance with Section VII, Chapters III and IV of Annex III to Regulation (EC) No 853/2004;
- satisfy the health standards laid down in Section VII, Chapter V of Annex III to Regulation (EC) No 853/2004 and the criteria laid down in Regulation (EC) No 2073/2005 on microbiological criteria for foodstuffs;
- have been packaged, stored and transported in compliance with Section VII, Chapters VI and VIII of Annex III to Regulation (EC) No 853/2004;
- have been marked and labelled in accordance with Section I of Annex II and Section VII, Chapter VII of Annex III to Regulation (EC) No 853/2004;
- in the case of pectinidae harvested outside classified production areas, comply with the specific requirements laid down in Section VII, Chapter IX of Annex III to Regulation (EC) No 853/2004; and
- have satisfactorily undergone the official controls laid down in Annex II to Regulation (EC) No 854/2004.

AND

II.2 (1) Animal health attestation for farmed/cultivated or wild caught aquatic animals or products thereof I, the undersigned official inspector, hereby certify that the farmed/cultivated or wild caught aquatic animals or products thereof intended for retail use or food service, referred to in Part I of this certificate:

II.2.1 originate from a country, territory, zone, or premises where the relevant diseases as listed by Directive 2006/88/EC are notifiable to the competent authority and reports of suspicion of infection of the relevant diseases prior to export must be immediately investigated by the official services;

II.2.2 did not show any increased morbidity or mortality that could be caused by one of the other relevant disease(s) of concern(2) not listed in Directive 2006/88/EC. Increased morbidity of mortality prior to export must be notified to and immediately investigated by the official services;

II.2.3 (3)(4) [and] / [or] their broodstock are not under any restriction by the exporting country's competent authority or intended for destruction or slaughter for disease control purposes; and

II.2.4 added transport water,(3) [and ice if included] as well as any other susceptible aquatic animals which contact the animals to be exported during transport, must be EITHER free of disease(s) of concern (2) specific to the species being exported OR treated in a manner that will destroy these pathogens prior to contact with the aquatic animals.

II.2.5 (3) [If the aquatic animals are live, they must also meet the following:

II.2.5.1 the shipment must be free from visible ectoparasites and intermediate hosts; and

II.2.5.2 only those species specified in the import permit are included in the shipment and must be free from fellow travellers OR (4) [for molluscs, if the shipment is not free of fellow travellers, then the shipment has been treated in a manner which will destroy the fellow travellers.]]

AND

II.3 (1) [Transport and labelling requirements I, the undersigned official inspector, hereby certify that:

II.3.1 the live aquatic animals or products thereof referred to above are placed under conditions, including with a water quality, that do not alter their health status;

II.3.2 the transport container or well boat prior to loading is clean and disinfected or previously unused;

II.3.3 the aquatic animal(s) being presented for importation must be packaged in a manner which prevents contact or exchange of animals or water between different shipments of aquatic animals on the same conveyance;

II.3.4 the aquatic animals must be packaged in shipping containers, holding units and/or conveyances that are either new or cleaned and disinfected. The shipping containers and/or holding units must prevent release of the shipping contents (eg. water or animals) while en route; and

II.3.5 the consignment is identified by a legible label on the exterior of the micro container, or when transported by well boat, in the ship's manifest, with the relevant information referred to in boxes I.7 to I.11 of Part I of this certificate, and the following statement:

"(3) [farmed or cultivated] (3) [wild caught] aquatic animals or products thereof intended for human consumption in Canada".]

All pages must be signed and stamped and the certificate must be presented at least in English and French..

Part I:

Box reference I.6: Indicate the Canadian Aquatic Animal Health Import Permit Reference Number as required for Part II.2 and Part II.3 Please see footnote 1 under Part II below.

Box reference I.7: Region of origin: For bivalve molluscs, indicate the production area.

Box reference I.11: Place of origin: Name and address of the dispatch establishment.

Box reference I.12: To be filled in on voluntary basis

Box reference I.15: Means of Transport: Indicate the names of ships and, if known, the flight numbers of aircraft. In the case of transport in containers or boxes, the total number of these and their registration and where there is a serial number of the seal it has to be indicated in box I.23.

Box reference I.21: Container / seal number: Where there is a serial number of the seal it has to be indicated.

Box reference I.25: Identification of the commodities: Use the appropriate Harmonised System (HS) codes of the World Customs Organisation of the following headings: 0301, 0302, 0303, 0304, 0305, 0306, 0307, 0308, 05.11, 15.04, 1516, 1518, 1603, 1604, 1605 or 2106.

Nature of commodity: Specify whether aquaculture or wild origin.

Treatment type: Specify whether live, frozen or processed.

Manufacturing plant: includes factory vessel, freezer vessel, cold store, processing plant, dispatch centre, and purification centre.

Part II:

(1) Part II.2, II.3 and II.4 do not apply to:

(a) aquatic animals of species which are not listed in CFIA's Susceptible Species of Aquatic Animals list fish which are slaughtered and eviscerated before dispatch.

(b) non viable molluscs and crustaceans, which means shucked or half shell molluscs and head off crustaceans

(c) aquatic animals and products thereof placed on the market for human consumption without further processing, provided that they are packed in retail sale packages which comply with the provisions for such packages in Regulation (EC) No 853/2004

In these cases a Canadian Aquatic Animal Health Import Permit Reference Number is not required.

- Water exchange for the transported animals is not permitted at in transit destinations.
