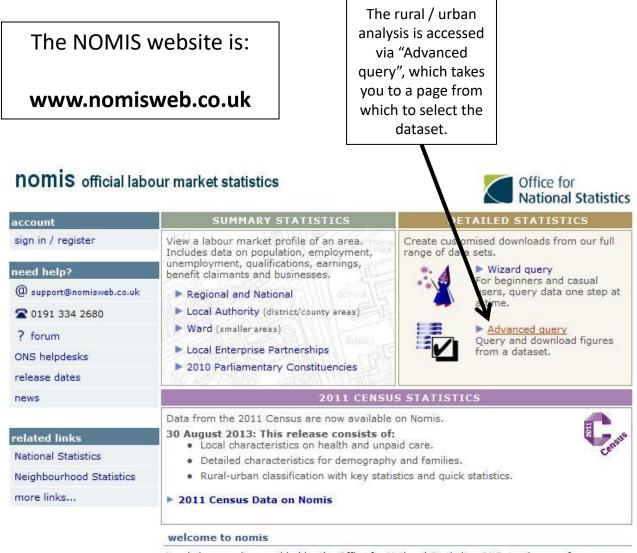
# New rural-urban analysis from the 2011 Census via NOMIS

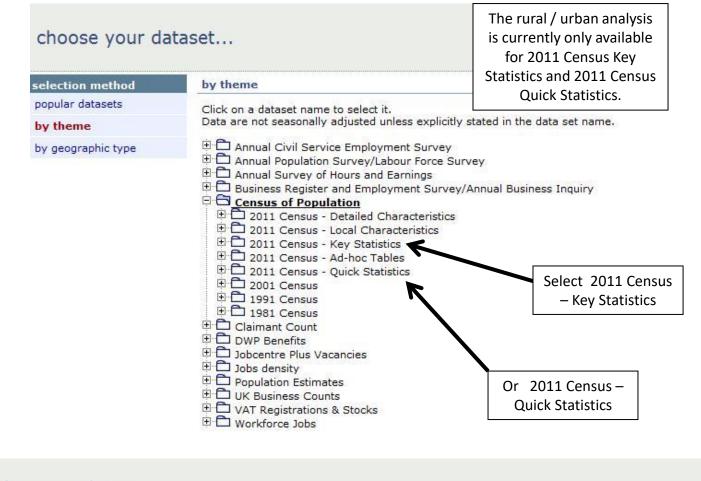
The new Rural – Urban Classification based on Census 2011 areas was published on 30 August 2013, as a joint project between the Office for National Statistics, the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs, the Department for Communities and Local Government, and the Welsh Assembly Government.

As a major development for urban-rural analysis, the classification has been integrated into NOMIS, a free ONS data service, to allow rural / urban analysis of 2011 Census data for England, Regions, and Local Authority areas.

This is a brief guide, prepared by Defra Rural Statistics, on how to produce rural / urban analysis.



Nomis is a service provided by the Office for National Statistics, ONS, to give you free access to the most detailed and up-to-date UK labour market statistics from official sources.

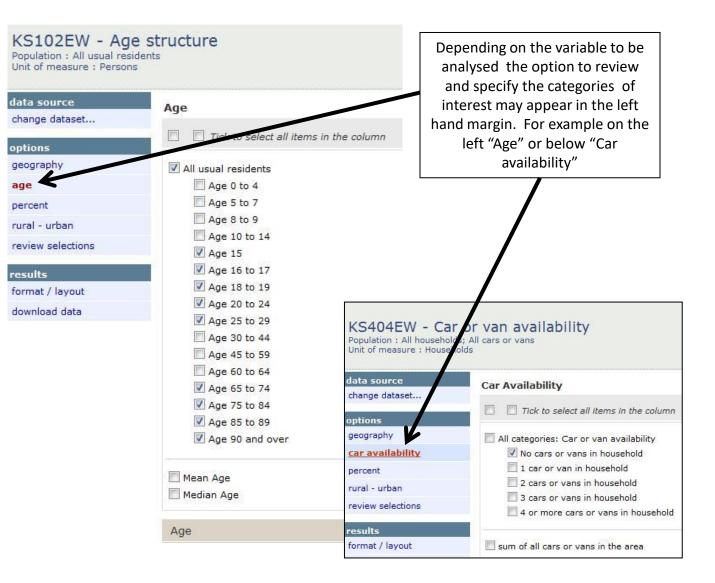
