RE: Request for Information - RFI3522

Thank you for your request for information which was processed in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

You requested the following information:

The June 2020 NAO report entitled Investigation into remediating dangerous cladding on high-rise buildings, stated: "Homes England estimates 274 homes are affected by ACM cladding, based on a comparison of Departmental building safety data and the Homes England Help to Buy loan accounts. Of these, 170 homes across 28 buildings have live loan accounts, with the remaining 104 homes having redeemed their loans. Of the 104 homes that have redeemed, Homes England received less than the equity loan originally lent on 27 homes."

Please provide your current, or most recent, estimate of the number of Help to Buy homes:

- 1. Affected by ACM cladding
- 2. Affected by other fire safety problems

For clarity, we will address each of your points in turn:


Please provide your current, or most recent, estimate of the number of Help to Buy homes: 1. Affected by ACM cladding

We can confirm that Homes England does not hold the information you have requested.

Advice and Assistance



Right to Appeal

If you are not happy with the information that has been provided or the way in which your request has been handled, you may request an internal review. You can request an internal review by writing to Homes England via the details below, quoting the reference number at the top of this letter.

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Your request for review must be made in writing, explain why you wish to appeal, and be received within 40 working days of the date of this response. Failure to meet this criteria may lead to your request being refused.

Upon receipt, your request for review will be passed to an independent party not involved in your original request. We aim to issue a response within 20 working days.

You may also complain to the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) however, the Information Commissioner does usually expect the internal review procedure to be exhausted in the first instance.
