between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of Antigua and Barbuda establishing a Maritime Boundary between Anguilla and Antigua and Barbuda

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TREATY BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND AND THE GOVERNMENT OF ANTIGUA AND BARBUDA ESTABLISHING A MARITIME BOUNDARY BETWEEN ANGUILLA AND ANTIGUA AND BARBUDA

The Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, in respect of itself and Anguilla, and the Government of Antigua and Barbuda (the "Parties");

Conscious of the cordial relations between the Parties based on the principles of good neighbourliness and the importance of the marine environment to their peoples;

Having regard to the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea, concluded at Montego Bay on 10th December 1982, to which Antigua and Barbuda and the United Kingdom are Parties;

Desiring to establish an all-purpose maritime boundary between the United Kingdom, in respect of Anguilla, and Antigua and Barbuda;

Have agreed as follows:

ARTICLE 1

Maritime Boundary

1) The boundary is understood to be an all-purpose boundary covering the water column, seabed and subsoil.

2) The maritime boundary between Anguilla and Antigua and Barbuda shall be formed by geodesic lines connecting the following points:

- 3) The line of delimitation is based on equidistance which is considered an equitable solution in this case.
- 4) After Point 15, the maritime boundary between Anguilla and Antigua and Barbuda shall extend along a line with a geodetic azimuth of 28.3 degrees until it reaches the outer limit of the maritime jurisdiction of the Parties.
- 5) Point 1 shall be the tripoint between the Parties and the Republic of France, as has been accepted in an exchange of diplomatic notes by the Republic of France.
- 6) The geodetic reference system used to calculate the position of the points listed in the table in Article 1(2) is WGS 84.
- 7) The boundary has been drawn, for the purposes of illustration only, on the map contained in the Annex to this Treaty.

ARTICLE 2

Parties' Positions on International Law of the Sea

The maritime boundary established by this Treaty shall not affect or prejudice in any manner either Party's position with respect to the rules of international law relating to the law of the sea, including those concerned with the exercise of sovereignty, sovereign rights, or jurisdiction with respect to the water column, seabed or subsoil.

ARTICLE 3

Dispute Resolution

Any dispute between the Parties in relation to the interpretation or the application of this Treaty shall be settled peacefully by consultation and negotiation between the Parties, in accordance with international law.

ARTICLE 4

Amendment

This Treaty may only be amended by mutual written agreement of the Parties.

ARTICLE 5

Entry into Force

The Parties shall notify each other in writing of the completion of their domestic procedures necessary to bring this Treaty into force. This Treaty shall enter into force 30 days after the receipt of the last notification of completion of the respective internal procedures.
