JUDGMENT

1. The Claimants were employees of the Respondent.
2. The Respondent made unlawful deductions from each of the Claimants' wages and is ordered to pay the following sums:
 - 2.1 The gross sum of **£1,948** to Mr Stewart;
 - 2.2 The gross sum of **£2,389.50** to Mr Murray;
 - 2.3 The gross sum of **£2,389.50** to Mr Gott.

These are all gross awards and the Claimants shall be liable to the Inland Revenue for any payments of tax and national insurance thereon.

3. The Claimants have each made a claim for breach of contract brought under the Employment Tribunals Extension of Jurisdiction (England and Wales) Order 1994 in respect of their notice pay and those claims are successful. The Respondent is ordered to pay the following sums to the Claimants:
 - 3.1 The net sum of **£460** to Mr Stewart;
 - 3.2 The net sum of **£540** to Mr Murray;
 - 3.3 The net sum of **£540** to Mr Gott.
