#### PROVISION OF REQUESTED INFORMATION

Thank you for your request for information on the importation of bumble lees which we received on 24 November 2020. Your request has been handled under the Environmental Information Regulations 2004(EIR).

The information you requested and our response is detailed below:

"Back in 2017 as a result of a request for information you gave me the importation figures for bumble bees. Please could I have the current figures for the years 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2020."

The data comes with the caveat that the 'Total Quantity' and 'Total Packages' columns are a direct transcription from the Trade Control and Expert System (TRACES) import certificates which can be very objective dependant on which member states is completing it; for example, some will refer to individual bees in a package and others will simply quote the number of packages. TRACES is a European Commission system employed by EU member states to facilitate and record animal/animal product movements into and throughout the EU.

The information that we have provided is a true reflection of the information that we have access to. We can't guarantee the accuracy of this data, as we can only rely on the information that has been input into TRACES by a third party
