PROVISION OF REQUESTED INFORMATION

Thank you for your request for information TB in wild deer from the Exmoor area which we received on 07 December 2020. Your request has been handled under the Environmental Information Regulations 2004(EIR).

The information you requested and our response is detailed below:

"I am coordinating a deer health monitoring project on Exmoor and you very kindly helped us last year with information about confirmed cases of TB in wild deer from the Exmoor area. I wondered if I might trouble you again to ask for an update on this information, please?

It would be most helpful to know deer species, sex, age and location of any positive cases from this area."

Listed in the table below are details of samples that were from deer from Exmoor National park or from the surrounding area (according to information given) and the samples were positive for *Mycobacterium bovis* on culture.

The samples were received at the APHA culture laboratory after 1st January 2018. The data was retrieved on 10th December 2020.

The month given is the month of receipt at TB culture laboratory.

The result from April 2018 was also provided previously.

It should not be assumed that the number of *Mycobacterium bovis* positive submissions reflects the disease prevalence. Notifications of tuberculous deer carcases and submission of samples from deer for *Mycobacterium bovis* culture are affected by many factors.

APHA is an Executive Agency of the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs and also works on behalf of the Scottish Government, Welsh Government and Food Standards Agency to safeguard animal and plant health for the benefit of people, the environment and the economy.
