**IV. Health Information**

I, the undersigned, certify that the birds described above meet the following requirements:

- a) I certify that I personally inspected all the birds on (date),  
and that no evidence of Newcastle disease, chlamydiosis, or other communicable disease of avians (poultry & birds) was found, nor insofar as can be determined, were the birds exposed to any such diseases during the 90 days immediately prior to the inspection date;
- b) insofar as can be determined, the birds have not been vaccinated with any H5 or H7 subtype of avian influenza vaccines;
- c) This consignment did not originate from, or (based on the route plan and declaration provided by the exporter) travel through, any zones within the APHIS-defined European Poultry Trade Region<sup>(1)</sup> that were restricted for outbreaks of Newcastle disease or HPAI in commercial poultry for the following period of time, whichever is later:
  - 1)\* until the restrictions were lifted by the national competent authority; **OR**
  - 2)\* 90 days after depopulation of all affected premises, followed by cleaning and disinfection of the last affected premises, in that zone.

[Note: only 1) applies if the restrictions had been placed for Newcastle disease or HPAI in racing pigeons, backyard flocks or wild birds.]
