JUDGMENT

Employment Tribunals Rules of Procedure 2013 – Rule 60

Upon the basis of admissions in the response, judgment is as follows:

1. The claimant was dismissed by reason of redundancy and is entitled to a redundancy payment of £9,584.45.
2. The respondent has made an unauthorised deduction from the claimant's wages by failing to pay the claimant in lieu of accrued but untaken holiday entitlement and is ordered to pay the claimant the gross sum of £1,671.13.
3. The respondent has made an unauthorised deduction from the claimant's wages by not paying wages to the claimant in the period 1 September 2020 to 10 November 2020 inclusive. Remedy will be the subject of a separate judgment to be issued on the papers or at a final hearing, as necessary.
4. The respondent was in breach of contract by not paying the claimant during her notice period. Remedy will be the subject of a separate judgment to be issued on the papers or at a final hearing, as necessary.
5. The complaint in relation to deduction of employee's pension contributions will be the subject of a separate judgment.

The Employment Tribunals (Interest) Order 1990 provides that sums of money payable as a result of a judgment of an Employment Tribunal (excluding sums representing costs or expenses), shall carry interest where the full amount is not paid within 14 days after the day that the document containing the tribunal's written judgment is recorded as having been sent to parties. That day is known as "*the relevant decision day*". The date from which interest starts to accrue is called "*the calculation day*" and is the day immediately following the relevant decision day.

The rate of interest payable is that specified in section 17 of the Judgments Act 1838 on the relevant decision day. This is known as "the stipulated rate of interest" and the rate applicable in your case is set out below.
