Minor and Necessary Modifications: Webinar

Join the Low Carbon Contracts Company (LCCC) for this webinar on the Minor and Necessary Modifications process in Allocation Round 4 (AR4).

LCCC is the Contracts for Difference (CfD) counterparty and one of the four CfD delivery partners.¹ The CfD regulations allow a generator who is or is considering making an application for a CfD to apply to LCCC for a 'minor and necessary modification' to the CfD Standard Terms.

This webinar will be an opportunity for generators to get an understanding of what constitutes a minor and necessary modification and what the process entails. It will also be an opportunity to ask LCCC questions about the process.
