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PUBLIC CONSULTATION NOTICE THE OFFSHORE OIL AND GAS EXPLORATION, PRODUCTION, UNLOADING AND STORAGE (ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT **ASSESSMENT) REGULATIONS 2020** Pegasus West Development

Spirit Energy North Sea Limited has made an application for consent to the Oil and Gas Authority ("the OGA") in relation to the above project.

Summary of Project

The Pegasus West gas discovery is located in block 43/13b of the United Kingdom Continental Shelf (UKCS), approximately 107 km north-east of Flamborough Head on the coast of England.

The development envisages the tie-back of the existing Pegasus West gas well to the existing Neptune Energy-operated Cygnus gas development located in block 44/12 of the UKCS. The development's primary elements are:

An approximately 57 km long, 10" gas production pipeline, starting in block 43/13b, traversing blocks 43/14, 43/15, and 44/11, and terminating in block 44/12.

 An approximately 57 km long umbilical from the Cygnus platform to the Pegasus West well providing hydraulic power for valve actuation, electrical power, signal capability and chemical injection.

Pegasus West gas will join Cygnus gas in being exported via the Eagles Transportation System pipeline for processing at the Perenco-operated terminal at Bacton in Norfolk, England.

The Pegasus West well is planned to be re-completed for production in 2022. The subsea construction work is expected to be executed in 2023, with first gas targeted for 2024.

Environmental Impact Assessment and Consent Process

In accordance with the above-mentioned Regulations, the project is subject to an environmental impact assessment procedure.

The OGA is responsible for deciding whether or not to grant consent for the project, but agreement to the grant of consent must be obtained from the Secretary of State for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy ("the Secretary of State") prior to consent being granted. The Secretary of State's decision on whether to agree to the grant of consent is based on the environmental impact assessment for the project.

The range of possible decisions in response to the application of consent is:

(a) the Secretary of State agrees to the OGA's grant of consent following the Secretary of State's conclusion regarding the environmental effects of the project, and the OGA grants consent, so the project may proceed;

(b) the Secretary of State refuses to agree to the OGA's grant of consent following the Secretary of State's conclusion regarding the environmental effects of the project, so the project may not proceed; or

(c) the Secretary of State agrees to the OGA's grant of consent following the Secretary of State's conclusion regarding the environmental effects of the project, but the OGA does not grant consent, so the project may not proceed.

Where the Secretary of State agrees to the grant of consent, conditions that Spirit Energy North Sea Limited must comply with may be attached to the agreement, including environmental conditions to avoid, prevent, reduce or offset any significant adverse effects on the environment, and measure to monitor such conditions.
