Thank you for your email of 19 November 2020 requesting the following information:

“Thank you for the reply, unfortunately they are of no help to my project / request as they a) mostly Hansard articles, and only apply to awards of 100%, and not incremented as I requested, I attach a copy of the Publication leaflet 9 that I have, with the details that I have requested: NB - pages 3 & 8 show the required, This is the only information have, and originated from the SPVA website around 2011, But I am unable to fine any more for the years 2012 – 2021.”

This was in relation to our response of 10 November 2020 to FOI2020/11446 where you requested the following information:

“The Rates of War Pensions and Allowances for the following years:-

2010 - 2011

2011 – 2012

2012 – 2013

2013 – 2014

2014 – 2015

2015 – 2016

2016 – 2017

2017 – 2018

2018 – 2019

2019 – 2020

2020 – 2021

Specifically covering the following 3 subject matters:

War Disablement Pension Other ranks – all % and weekly rates GBP £

Gratuities All ranks 5 and amounts GBP £

Allowances and supplements for disablement pensioners -Age Allowance from 65 all % and weekly rates other ranks – weekly GBP£

These would be from the Leaflet-9 publications That are issued annually and Produced by Service Personnel and Veterans Agency / Veterans-UK.

These could be – copies of the publications themselves, Typed amounts, pdf files of each publication or the Internet URLs of each Leaflet-9.”

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence (MOD), and I can confirm that all of the information in scope of your request is held.

However, your request falls under Section 21 (Information reasonably accessible to the applicant by other means) of the FOIA. Section 21 provides an absolute exemption. This means that if the requested information is held by the public authority, and it is reasonably accessible to the applicant by other means, it is not subject to the public interest test.

Under Section 16 of the FOIA (advice and assistance), the information you have requested can be found in the Service Pensions Order for each of the years
