Thank you for your correspondence of 12 April 2021 requesting the following information:

"Could you please advise as to:

The number of and proportion of applicants to join the RAF as an officer who had a degree and went on to successfully complete IOTC.

The number and proportion of those applicants who were prospective pilots, who went on to successfully complete IOTC, graduating as pilot.

The average age of the individuals that successfully enlisted to the RAF as pilot.

If this request is unclear could I request that you please come back to me soonest so that I may adjust accordingly?"

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA). A search for the information has now been completed, and I can confirm that some information in scope of you request is held.

Data sets in this request have been provided for financial years 2012/13 to 2018/19.

In accordance with the Data Protection Act and our obligations in relation to the protection of confidentiality when handling personal data, data has been rounded to the nearest 10. When rounding to the nearest 10, numbers ending in 5 have been rounded to the nearest multiple of 20 to prevent systematic bias.

In response to question 1 and 2, the Royal Air Force (RAF) does not hold recorded data for the Financial Years 2012/13, and the first half of Financial year 2013/14 for the number of cadets who enter and pass the Initial Officer Training Course (IOTC).

1) The number of and proportion of applicants to join the RAF as an officer who had a degree and went on to successfully complete IOTC.

^{*}This figure includes cadets currently in training, as they have not withdrawn from their courses and are still expected to graduate.

Data only includes those who have opted to self-declare that they have a degree level qualification and is for overall passes for the IOTC within their training cohorts.

2) The number and proportion of those applicants who were prospective pilots, who went on to successfully complete IOTC, graduating as pilot.

The numbers of pilot cadets who entered and completed IOTC in the financial years 2012/13 to 2019/20, is as follows:

Data is for overall passes for the IOTC within their training cohorts.

3) The average age of the individuals that successfully enlisted to the RAF as pilot.

The average age of individuals that successfully enlisted into the RAF as a pilot is 23 years and 4 months.
