Thank you for your email of 21 April requesting the following information:

- "" Can you please provide the following information under the Freedom of Information Act:
- 1. The total number of personal injury claims settled by the Ministry with a payment of damages and/ or a periodical payment order (PPO), broken down by the following settlement tranches (up to £1.7 million, £1.7 million +)
- 2. A breakdown of your response to question 1 by the number of claims which included a periodical payment order (PPO) as part of the settlement.

Can you please provide the above information for the following years: 2019/20, 2018/19 and 2017/18"

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA). A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence. I am writing to confirm that MOD holds the information on the subject you have requested.

Please note that the MOD publish statistics on common law compensation claims. The latest update covering the period 2019/20 was published 10 December 2020: <a href="https://www.gov.uk/government/collections/mod-compensation-claims-statistics">https://www.gov.uk/government/collections/mod-compensation-claims-statistics</a>

Table 3 of the report provides the number of Employer's Liability – Service personal injury claims that have been settled in the financial years of interest. Please note that the term **settled** relates to claims where damages have been awarded to the claimant and damages and associated legal costs have been paid. The financial year in which settlement is recorded is not necessarily the year in which the damages were paid or any periodical payment order (PPO) was set up.

The table above does not include claims where damages have been settled but legal costs remain outstanding. There may be additional PPOs that have been set up within the Financial years specified but have not been included as the costs of the claim have not yet settled.

Please note that the Information Commissioner will not normally investigate your case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
