Key points

GUMCAD STI Surveillance System

This document provides a useful summary of the GUMCAD STI Surveillance System. It should be read in conjunction with the <u>GUMCAD</u>: <u>clinical guidelines</u> (see <u>Other useful information</u> section), which provides more detailed guidance on how to submit GUMCAD data to UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA).

What is the GUMCAD STI Surveillance System

An anonymised patient-level electronic dataset which collects information on diagnoses made and services provided by specialist (Level 3) and non-specialist (Level 2) services. The GUMCAD STI Surveillance System supersedes GUMCADv2 and is an approved mandatory dataset.

Who needs to collect

All commissioned specialist (Level 3) and non-specialist (Level 2) sexual health services in the table below are required to collect information on STI diagnoses and service provision.

GPs that are commissioned to provide Level 2 Sexual Health services (Enhanced GPs), are no longer required to submit GUMCAD on a mandatory basis – however, submissions can be made on a voluntary basis if required. Enhanced GPs should contact their service commissioner to determine whether they are required to make voluntary submissions. Any Enhanced GPs that wish to make voluntary submissions will need to provide their own GUMCAD reporting software.

Reporting period

Each submission covers one calendar quarter (Q1: January to March, Q2: April to June, Q3: July to September and Q4: October to December).

Frequency of reporting

Services are required to submit data no later than 6 weeks after the end of the calendar quarter.

Data format

A single comma delimited (CSV) file.

Data submission

Submissions must be made to UKHSA through the <u>HIV and STI Data Exchange (HSDE)</u>. See Other useful information section.

GUMCAD data items

Sixty-four data items (see Summary of GUMCAD data items).

Episode activity (STI coding)

All NHS primary care services (including sexual health) are expected to be SNOMED (as of April 2020). Therefore, GUMCAD episode activity data should now be reported using SNOMED codes (instead of SHHAPT or READ codes). However, UKHSA will continue to accept SHHAPT and READ codes in GUMCAD extracts to facilitate ongoing SNOMED implementation; SHHAPT and READ codes will be retired once SNOMED implementation is complete and all sexual health services are reporting SNOMED codes. Code look-ups can be found in the GUMCAD: data specification and technical guidance document.

How to record and extract GUMCAD data

What to record

GUMCAD consists of 64 data items. Most items should be routinely recorded when a patient presents to the service with a sexual health related issue. Some items are only recorded when relevant to patient care. The list of data items can be found under <u>Summary tables of GUMCAD</u> data items below.

GUMCAD is an approved mandatory dataset. All eligible services and associated software providers should ensure they have the appropriate infrastructure in place to complete this dataset.

How to record

The GUMCAD team at UKHSA has worked with all the major software providers of sexual health services to ensure that GUMCAD data items can be recorded in their software. Please contact the GUMCAD team or your software provider if you are unable to record any items.

When to record

Specialist (Level 3)

All patient consultations.

Non-specialist (Level 2)

Only patients attending for sexual health related issues. Table '<u>Episode Activity: list of GUMCAD diagnoses and services</u>' provides the diagnoses, conditions and services indicating when GUMCAD data should be submitted, that is an episode that can be coded using SHHAPT, READ or SNOMED (see <u>GUMCAD: data specification and technical guidance</u> document for code look-up tables).

How to extract data

Your patient software system should have a GUMCAD data extraction tool as standard. Please contact your software provider for guidance on how to extract data from your system. Services wishing to use their own bespoke data extraction tool must ensure that data coding and formats comply with GUMCAD data requirements. Please review the GUMCAD: data Specification and technical guidance document (see Other useful information section).

How to submit data

GUMCAD data contains patient identifiable information (PII) and should NEVER be submitted via email.

Data extracts should only be submitted to UKHSA using the <u>HIV and STI Data Exchange</u> (<u>HSDE</u>). The HSDE enables data to be submitted in a secure manner across the internet using the Transport Layer Security (TLS) method of communication.
